### **Foreword**

The third month of the year brought with it a number of milestones that impact our services in a positive way.

We started off with the work on the Skolasajf children's applications, and these were in fact opened to the public on 22nd March 2023. The uptake was immediately a very positive one and we encourage parents to register their children before the **deadline of 3rd May 2023**. Any queries can be submitted via the FES FB page or directed to the FES Head Office landline on **22586829**. Queries can also be referred to the **Freephone 153**, and assistance with the application process is available also at any of the **servizz.gov hubs**.

The applications were officially launched during a press conference at the San Gwann Primary School. It was also the occasion to present the new Skolasajf logo and the FES website. The Skolasajf logo is an instant reference to the concept of the **theme "Peace by Piece"**. The illustration shows different jigsaw pieces making up the whole. The new website shows a number of new features. The changes were not merely an issue of aesthetics but were aimed to improve the function of the site, making it more user friendly and with information being more easily accessible.

During March we also had an intense training programme in our childcare centres, such that now all the staff members in the centres practice the Emergent Curriculum. Training was also on the table for the Skolasajf staff members, as their training was planned for the coming months, in conjunction with IfE. 






## ANNOUNCEMENTS NEW FES WEBSITE

The service provided by Klabb 3-16, is also extended to offer service users an educational experience during school holidays.

You can also contact the chosen centre directly, ask for a tour of the place, and get the application directly from there.



Children can be registered at the centre by handing over to the Centre Coordinator, the filled-in application form together with the necessary documents. Only one application per child is to be submitted.

The Centre Coordinators and the FES FB Messenger service are always available to answer your queries. The Centre Coordinators will also be available to help you fill in the application form.


The childcare service is offered to children until they are eligible to move on to the government Kindergarten on the 1st of February, while children who are three years of age by the end of December are eligible for Kindergarten on the 1st of October, of that same calendar year.

# THE EMERGENT CURRICULUM

### IN ALL THE FES CHILDCARE CENTRES





The training was delivered by the Programme Coordinator Ms Kathryn Xuereb and entailed hands-on training for both the Centre Coordinators Childcare and for the Educators.



The peer-to-peer training experience and hands-on training at Is-Sardinella Childcare Centre. encouraged the Centre Coordinators to share knowledge and to cultivate a collaborative work environment.

This was followed by six individual microseminars within each participating centre. The Centre Coordinators trained their own staff with the intention of ingraining the child-led pedagogy in the daily activities, and improving the skill set of their teams.



# CHILDCARE ACTIVITIES





The children at Il-Bejta Childcare Centre got to be little hairdressers for a day, when they were visited at the centre by professional hairdressers from the Twice As Nice salon.

Some children might be scared or unsure at their first visit to the hairdresser. This activity served to address the associated anxiety, alleviate any fear by making the service an ordinary event, and to create a good relationship between the children and the hairdresser. The hairdresser showed them her tools and explained their use in simple terms. The children were allowed to handle safe hairdressing tools and engaged in pretend play. The hairdressers also showed them how to use the tools on themselves and then styled the children's hair in their preferred styles.

At the end of the activity, the children were given the opportunity to create and draw their own unique hairstyle on a colouring sheet. More images are found on the **Il-Bejta** Facebook page.


