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# WORK WITH US - NEW ROLE AT SKOLASAJF

The sole remit will be to deliver a performing arts programme according to the genre practised by the applicant, throughout the period of Skolasajf 2023. Each eligible applicant will be called for an interview, part of which would be a presentation of the programme which the applicant intends to implement in the centre.

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## HOW TO APPLY FOR OUR CHILDCARE SERVICES

You can also contact the chosen centre directly, ask for a tour of the place, and get the application directly from there.



Children can be registered at the centre by handing over to the Centre Coordinator, the filled-in application form together with the necessary documents. Only one application per child is to be submitted.

The Centre Coordinators and the FES FB Messenger service are always available to answer your queries. The Centre Coordinators will also be available to help you fill in the application form.

The childcare service is offered to children until they are eligible to move on to the government Kindergarten on the 1st of February, while children who are three years of age by the end of December are eligible for Kindergarten on the 1st of October, of that same calendar year.

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# CHILDCARE SEMINAR

### Emma Camilleri Playworker Skolasajf

### 1.What are you currently studying and how did you decide that you wanted to work with Skolasajf?

I am currently studying for a Masters degree in Primary Education at the University of Malta. This is the reason why I work with Skolasajf. It gives me the opportunity to gain experience, including learning how to manage difficulties and challenges, how to create a work routine, and what children enjoy the most or least. Other useful tips for my future career include how to work with colleagues such as the Coordinator, the Child Support Worker and even other Playworkers, and sharing tips on how to manage challenging behaviour, tips on specific activities that children really enjoy and other activities that maybe weren't so successful.

#### 2. Could you describe one of your typical workdays as a Playworker?

On arriving at the centre, I prepare the classroom environment to welcome the children, and then prepare for the activities of that day by using the weekly plan. For example, if we are doing cooking, I prefer to prepare all the ingredients close by to have them handy for the activity. If we are going to do a painting activity, I make sure I have all the colours and paints available in class. When it is time for the children to arrive, I welcome them and accompany them to class. I start with the daily time-table, which usually starts off with a Circle Time session. Other activities include activities form the Skolasajf Programme, sports and games with the Sports Playworker, story telling and reading sessions. The weekly schedule is also enhanced with a number of partners and outings, which are really fun and make the day more exciting.

### 3. What is your favourite part about the role of a Playworker and what do you find to be the most rewarding?

My favourite part about the role of a Playworker is the fact that I get to meet a group of lovely children every summer and spend the whole summer playing games, doing activities, learning and having fun together! It's really sweet seeing children enjoy themselves, have fun, socialise, make new friends, eat, cook and play. When children come to Skolasajf everyday eager to start their day and participate in the activities and actually tell you that they really enjoyed their summer with you, I believe that this is very rewarding!

#### 4. Which part of your role do you find most challenging?

The climatic conditions of our Maltese summer are a challenge in themselves as they affect the energy levels. However, I always try to plan fun and leisurely activities, I also make sure that the children drink water frequently and sometimes we take a water break where we wet a bit our faces to feel refreshed! The children really enjoy this. Managing things on your own can also be challenging, however the Centre Coordinators are helpful and encouraging. Another challenge is to build a good relationship between the PW and the CSW in the class, to work together to create a fun and meaningful summer experience for the children.

#### 5. What advice do you have for someone new to this role at Skolasajf?

Following are some tips that anyone can use to make sure to use the time efficiently and make the day enjoyable for the children.

1. Make sure to seek for help when you're not sure about something. Make sure you know what the procedures are. Ask when you do not know.

2. Communication is key. Communicate with other PW's and the CSW's in your classroom. Communicate with the PER and the Coordinator. I believe it is very important.

3. Plan fun activities from the Programme to make sure the activities are successful, fun and easy to implement for you and for the children. The CSW will have the same plan of activities and will modify as needed.

4. Make sure to arrive on time everyday to have some time to prepare the class, activities and yourself!

5. Prepare a good healthy lunch and a big bottle of water to keep yourself hydrated and to have enough energy and motivation to implement more activities and games with the children.

6. Make sure that the children are enjoying themselves and not feeling bored.

7. In the case of very young children like Kinder 1,2 and Year 1 make sure to take them to the bathroom frequently and to drink water frequently. I worked most of my Summers with Kinder and it's very important to dedicate water breaks as very young children forget that they need to drink.

8. I always find it useful to create a daily time-table. This helps me feel at ease and will know what is next on the agenda at a glance.

#### 6. What is your plan for the future?

My plan for the future is to become a Primary Teacher and after that I plan on dedicating my time to Research. I love to carry out research and learn more about Education, teaching and learning. My favourite area is Education for Sustainable Development. However, I look forward to working at Skolasajf during my summer holidays as it is the best way to not only earn some extra money, but also fill up my time in a meaningful way, and enjoy some time having fun with the children in my class!

### 1.What are you currently studying and how did you decide that you wanted to work with Skolasajf?

I have just started working as a Primary School Teacher at Msida Primary this year. I teach Year 3 students. The reason why I choose to work with Skolasajf is because I love working with children and helping them reach their full potential. This will be my 5th year working at Skolasajf, both as a Playworker as well as a Sports Playworker.

#### 2. Could you describe one of your typical workdays as a Sports Playworker?

A typical day would include preparing and making sure all of the equipment required for the day is clean and is set up in the morning so that when the children come for the PE session, there are no inconsistencies. Afterwards, I start the sessions with the different class groups, all whilst making sure that all needs are catered for as much as possible. AT the end of the day, I collect all of the remaining equipment and reflect on which activities went according to plan, which ones did not, and how I can improve them.

### 3. What is your favourite part about the role of a Sports Playworker and what do you find to be the most rewarding?

My favourite part about this job is getting to see all of the children: regardless of race, gender, and physical difference, playing, striving and working together towards the same goal – that of having fun. All whilst helping them learn different essential values which will be vital in their continuous development as citizens of tomorrow. That, in itself is very rewarding, something which cannot be said about all jobs.

#### 4. Which part of your role do you find most challenging?

Probably making sure that I cater for all the needs of the different children within your lesson. Goes without saying that the biggest challenges often have the highest of rewards, and this is no different. Seeing the children happy after having catered accordingly is worth its weight in gold.

#### 5. What advice do you have for someone new to this role at Skolasajf?

My advice is to be prepared so that you will enjoy the experience, have fun and be grateful that you have a job which will instill happiness in others; a rare opportunity to be appreciated.

#### 6.What is your plan for the future?

My plan for the future is to continue striving to become a better teacher overall and to continue appreciating and understanding others.


