Foreword

With just a few days away from the commencement of Skolasajf 2023 **Peace by Piece**, it is little wonder that the FES staff members at Head Office and in the centres have a hectic schedule. Whether it is answering parents' queries, scheduling meetings for parents and training sessions for staff, liaising with new partners who



want to join the long list of stakeholders in the Skolasajf programme, procuring all the resources needed, and tackling financial matters which concern the service, the workload means that really all hands are on deck. Everyone is working tirelessly to ensure that every detail is meticulously planned, creating a transformative experience for all students.

This year Skolasajf will be welcoming 12,030 children; employing 2,200 staff members, of which 1833 are Playworkers and Child Support Workers; opening 54 centres; and working with over 60 partners. The staff members within the different roles have all received training, whether in-house by FES Head Office staff, or in partnership with the Institute for Education and SportMalta.

While all this is going on, we of course are still offering two other concurrent services in our Childcare and Klabb 3-16 Centres. These two services offer their challenges and satisfactions, as can be evidenced in the dedicated pages inside this Newsletter and on our Facebook pages. The encouraging words of praise from the parents of our service users in childcare are ongoing, however this time we decided to share some of them with you.

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SKOLASAJF TRAINING FOR SPORTS PLAYWORKERS

The fast pace of Skolasajf preparations is at its peak and will soon come to an end, with the commencement of the service on 12th July 2023.

These preparations include training for over 1500 Playworkers, Child Support Workers, and also Sports Playworkers. The latter have in fact just completed an intensive session with SportMalta coaches, held at the Kirkop Sports Complex.

The session started with a lecture by **Mr Robert Portelli, Head of Sport Programmes at SportMalta.** Mr Portelli delivered an engaging session on the fundamental principles of physical education, how it benefits the human body, and how to encourage children to embrace a lifestyle that includes physical activity. He also discussed the use of the Skolasajf Sports and Games Manual and ways how to implement it.

This lecture was followed by two gruelling sessions of group work and sport activities under the guidance of four SportMalta coaches.

The aim of this training session was of course to prepare the Sport Playworkers for their duties. However, a common comment on their way out was "Tiring but worth it".

FES would like to thank **SportMalta** for their support and commitment. We also thank the Sports Playworkers for their energy and enthusiasm, which they will transmit to the Skolasajf students.

HOW TO APPLY FOR OUR CHILDCARE SERVICES

You can also contact the chosen centre directly, ask for a tour of the place, and get the application directly from there.



Children can be registered at the centre by handing over to the Centre Coordinator, the filled-in application form together with the necessary documents. Only one application per child is to be submitted.

The Centre Coordinators and the FES FB Messenger service are always available to answer your queries. The Centre Coordinators will also be available to help you fill in the application form.

The childcare service is offered to children until they are eligible to move on to the government Kindergarten on the 1st of February, while children who are three years of age by the end of December are eligible for Kindergarten on the 1st of October, of that same calendar year.

Name: Luana Sheehan

Role: **PER at Qawra Skolasajf**

What does your role as a PER at Skolasajf entail?

Being in one of the largest centres, my work as a PER is very wide and carries with it a number of responsibilities which I share with my other PER colleagues. My work includes responsibilities towards the children, towards my colleagues, towards parents and towards the Centre Coordinator. I liaise with the coordinator in accomplishing the needs of the centre in relation to resources and stationery needed. It is my responsibility to cater for the different year groups in the centre.

During Skolasajf, I am able to organise outings and activities by communicating with partners for the centre-based activities, sending weekly emails with information on the weekly activities and outings to parents, dealing with everyday issues and checking on the day-to-day class activities as scheduled by the relative Playworkers. I also prepare, along with my PER colleagues, the reconciliation sheets after every activity and after concluding financial matters relative to the specific activity. Lastly, there would be the need to help the Centre Coordinator with the administrative work like recording of Sick Leave and Vacation Leave, preparing the monthly signing sheets and to photocopy the essential forms and applications.

Now that Skolasajf is 2 weeks away, how are you preparing for the start of Skolsajf?

Preparation would include: organizing the setting up of the office assigned to the administration, choosing the best transport prices for the scheduled outings and contacting partners for the centre based activities, choosing the best venues for the outings according to the different age groups, assigning classes according to the applications sent, joining in meetings with the Centre Coordinator, with parents and with staff, preparing the calendar of events, concluding pending Klabb 3-16 work,, answering emails regarding requests by parents, photocopy of needed forms and preparing for the needs of the year group assigned to me by the Centre Coordinator. This year I will be in charge of the Kinder classes and being a Kindergarten Educator myself, I feel that I am in a very good position to know how to adequately deal with this particular year group.

Which is your favourite and least favourite part of your role?

The favourite part of my job is organising outings and activities, as well as making sure that all is in place so that the children will be satisfied and will enjoy what Skolasajf has to offer. The least favourite part is when I would have to pinpoint certain discrepancies in the behaviour of the staff, especially if they are things which would have been noted and addressed to times before.

Do you remember your first day as a PER? Were you nervous or excited?

I remember when I first was assigned the job of a PER, I was very excited and quite proud of myself. I was a bit nervous too, however I was determined to do the best I could. It was quite an experience for me, as the Centre Coordinator in the Centre I was working in was about to leave and therefore I knew that I would have to deal with the situation on my own despite the fact that I was new to everything. However, I must have made a good job of it as the new CC who came some six months after was very pleased and satisfied with what I had been doing. Looking back, I'm proud of myself that I took this step in my career.

What advice do you have for someone wanting to apply as a PER?

I would advise anyone applying for the PER post to know in detail what the duties and responsibilities of a PER entail and that the most important thing is to be ready to liaise continually and discuss seriously any issues with the Centre Coordinator. It's such a rewarding role to have!

Skolasajf is not a new experience for you. What roles have you covered in the past years?

I started Skolasajf as part of my summer placement when I was still doing my course at University. Since then I haven't stopped. Your professional occupation is that of a teacher. How does the Skolasajf experience enrich your full-time job?

Definitely. From the Skolasajf experience you learn a lot of Skills and insights which you take with you in Winter. Being in different roles enriches you with skills and experiences.

If you had to give one piece of advice to Skolasajf employees, to practice inclusion that ensures all students can access learning, what would it be?

Always be positive, and open. Challenges always crop up but with a positive attitude we will find the best solutions. Assisting students and being their voice whilst helping them to reach their best potential is very motivating.

Skolasajf is a demanding project, yet like many other colleagues, you return from one year to another. Why? I love the experience, and fulfilling my responsibilities when doing my role gives me great satisfaction especially when I feel that I am helping and supporting others.
